Math Instructions

1. Go to <https://www.ixl.com/signin/gchs> or click IXL Math from the student menu on the CSS webpage
2. Enter your username and password in the top right corner of the page
 - a. **You must be logged in to receive credit**
 - b. If you forget your username and password, please call the main office and ask or email: Dee Driscoll. (ddriscoll@gcsd.k12.nj.us)
3. Click on the GRADE LEVEL you have just COMPLETED (ex.: Kindergarten going into 1st will click on Kindergarten)
4. Please complete the topics/skills below until you reach a Smartscore of 80 or have worked for 30 minutes on that topic. (complete before school starts in September)
5. Once all eight skills are completed, you are finished!

There is nothing to submit. Teachers will be able to track your time/days/dates spent on assignments.
