

Hispanic Heritage Application Link

Eligibility

- Be currently enrolled in high school or home school program and graduating in the spring of 2025
- Must have a minimum unweighted 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale or 7.5 on a 10.0 scale
- Must enroll at an accredited higher education institution in 2025-2026
- Be of Hispanic heritage (includes Spain, Brazil, Philippines)
- If selected, attendance to the virtual regional awards ceremony is mandatory

Gold, Silver, and Bronze recipients are selected in each category and receive a one-time grant to fund their college education or to fund a community service effort that tackles a social issue, and then one national Awardee is selected in each of the categories.

Elks National Foundation Scholarship Program

Elks Scholarship Application Link

Deadline: November 12, 2024

Eligibility:

- Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks.
- High school graduates are not eligible to apply.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are submitted; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.

Hagan Scholarship

Hagan Scholarship Application

Deadline: December 1, 2024

Award: \$15,000 each year for 4 years

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Must attend a public, private, charter, magnet, or STEM high school located in the United States.
- 2. Must be fluent in the English language.
- 3. Must be in the high school graduating class.
- 4. Must have achieved a 3.50 Cumulative Grade Point Average.
- 5. Must enroll in an eligible four-year or higher not-for-profit College or University the first fall semester following high school graduation. The Hagan Scholarship cannot be used to attend a community college or online institution.
- 6. Must maintain a four year or less graduation schedule in college, or complete the equivalent of a four year degree if in a professional program.
- 7. Must work 240 hours from January 1, 2025 until September 1, 2025. Work must be regularly scheduled employment performed under supervision for compensation. Employment can be full-time or part-time, or a combination of the two.
- 8. Applicant's Adjusted Gross Household Income reported for 2023 Federal Income Tax Purposes must not have exceeded \$100,000. "Household Income" is defined as the total income received by all members of a household living under the same roof.
- 9. Applicants selected as Finalists must provide the first two pages of their FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) showing their Student Aid Index (SAI).
- 10. Must apply for Federal and State grants if eligible.
- Must not have a felony conviction.



Unigo \$10K Scholarship

Application Deadline: December 31, 2024

Details: Being funny can get you far in life - it makes people like you and may open up a lot of doors. Smart people are generally always in demand, and they can usually command high salaries. Eligibility Requirements:

- Be thirteen (13) years of age or older at the time of application
- Be legal residents of the fifty (50) United States or the District of Columbia
- Be currently enrolled (or enroll no later than the fall of 2026) in an accredited post-secondary institution
 of higher education

Each year, the Program selects numerous recipients to receive a \$10,000 scholarship renewable for up to an additional three years – up to \$40,000 total per recipient. Awards are for undergraduate study and may be used for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board. In addition, Scholars are invited to participate in a special awards program and receive ongoing leadership-development support.

- demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship;
- demonstrate strong academic performance (minimum 3.0 grade point average/4.0 scale or equivalent);
- be citizens of the United States of America;
- be current high school seniors attending high school in the United States (students living on U.S. Armed Forces base and homeschooled students are also eligible); and
- plan to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study toward a bachelor's degree at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States for the entire upcoming academic year.

Semifinalists will be required to provide a recommendation from a community leader, such as a high school principal, elected official or executive director of a nonprofit organization, and must provide documentation to certify academic performance and financial need. Scholarships can be used to subsidize the costs of tuition, school books, fees, on-campus room and board, approved educational tutoring, and other educational expenses deemed appropriate by the student's school and approved by the GSM scholarship committee.

Gold Star Mission is proud to offer scholarships to anyone with an Illinois connection seeking higher education, whether it be an undergraduate degree, a certificate, or a trades/technical certification.

To apply for a Gold Star Mission Educational Scholarship, applicants must be a high school senior at the time of application, have either a high school diploma or GED, or be currently enrolled in an accredited college or certificate granting institution (such as vocational school).

The ICMA-RC Public Employee Memorial Scholarship Fund (ICMA-RC Memorial Scholarship Fund) was founded in 2001 to honor the lives of our nation's police officers, firefighters, and other local and state government employees who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

The fund provides financial assistance to the surviving spouses and children of employees who have died in the line of duty and are planning to attend an accredited two-year community college, four-year accredited university, or vocational school full-time.

- Children and spouses of local and state government employees who have died in the line of duty may apply for the ICMA-RC Public Employee Memorial Scholarship Fund.
- The applicant must provide a letter from the deceased employee's place of work.
- The applicant must currently attend or plan to attend school full-time at an accredited two-year community college, four-year accredited university, or vocational school at the time of application.
- Study can be at the undergraduate, graduate, or technical level.
- Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, age, gender, disability, or national origin.

Applications are accepted annually from December 15 – March 15. They must be mailed to Scholarship America at the address below, along with a current complete official transcript postmarked no later than March 15 of each year. Online transcripts and grade reports are not accepted.
